RAA Use of cookies

RAA uses Google Adwords and Google Analytics to collect visitor information. This allows RAA to collect information about the traffic on its websites and advertise online to visitors to our site. One of the primary methods used by Google Analytics is the placement of cookies. Cookies are small information files sent from a website and stored on a user's computer while they are on a particular website.

These cookies do not collect any personally identifiable information, nor do they allow RAA to use personally identifiable information with other remarketing lists or cookies.

Visitors can opt out of Google Analytics for Display Advertising and customize Google Display Network ads using the Ads Preferences Manager or Google Analytics opt out browser add-on.

South Australian Tourism Commission Use of cookies

In order to provide websites that are easy to use, reliable and contain useful and relevant information; the SATC's websites use "cookies". Cookies are small amounts of information that may be placed on your device, such as a computer or mobile phone, in order to track your visit. Cookies help the SATC to remember who you are. The SATC uses cookies to help make your subsequent visits to its websites simpler and more seamless. For example, the SATC uses cookies to help deliver personalised website content and navigation to provide better user experiences. The SATC uses cookies to recognise whether you were a previous visitor to its websites, enabling it to load relevant and saved information.

The cookies on SATC websites do not store personal details such as your name, address, telephone number or payment information, but may include your IP address, referring site and pages visited on SATC websites. IP addresses are logged to track a user's visit while the user remains anonymous. SATC analyses this data for certain trends and statistics, such as which parts of SATC websites users are visiting and for how long. SATC does not link your IP address to anything that identifies you.

You can set your browser to alert you to when you receive a cookie, giving you the chance to decide whether or not to accept it. However, by not accepting cookies, some web pages may not display properly or you may not be permitted to access certain information.

The SATC uses Analytics cookies to collect anonymous data, including but not limited to geographic location, time spent on its websites, how you reached the SATC's websites, what pages you visited and keywords you used to search the websites.

The SATC uses advertising cookies and technologies including Adobe, Facebook and Google for the purposes of analytics and online behavioural advertising. This enables the SATC and its partners to serve you with advertising content that is more relevant to your interests.
